AGENDA HIGHLIGHTS

Wednesday will feature a keynote address by James Reese, Ph.D., CEO, James T. Reese and Associates, Williamsburg, Va. Dr. Reese is an internationally known, award-winning author, speaker and trainer. He is CEO of the James T. Reese and Associates training and consulting firm and is a Premier Speaker of the National Center for Crisis Management, adjunct faculty of the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation, diplomat of the Society for Police and Criminal Psychology, fellow of the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress and Distinguished "General Graves B. Erskine Series Lecturer." Among his more than 3,000 speaking awards, he received the Speaker's Medal from the World Congress on Stress; the

Director of the FBI's "Award for Distinguished Service"; an honorary Olympic Gold Medal for his assistance at the 2002 Winter Olympics; and the "Iron Cross Award" for his assistance at the World Trade Center, beginning the day after the attack on September 11, 2001.

During this informative presentation, Dr. Reese will discuss "*Ethics and Integrity in Schools*." In the education profession, perhaps more so than any other profession, ethical behavior and personal integrity are essential components of success. Dr. Reese will discuss the following topics: Divisions in the Workplace; The Fear of Change; Integrity, Ethics, Courage, Authority, and Influence; Ten Traits of a Good Leader; Traits Associated with Failure; Most Common Mistakes; and Six Keys to Stress-Free Living(c).

Also on Wednesday, participants will choose from 18 half-day institute sessions. Sworn law enforcement and juvenile probation officers will have the opportunity to attend a full-day Internet Safety, Protecting Kids Online training.

Thursday's format features a keynote session by Sandra L. Bloom, M.D., associate professor of health management and policy and co-director of the Center for Nonviolence and Social Justice at the School of Public Health of Drexel University, Philadelphia, Pa. Dr. Bloom is a board-certified psychiatrist, graduate of Temple University School of Medicine and recipient of the Temple University School of Medicine Alumni Achievement Award. Dr. Bloom is a past-president of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies. From 1980-2001, Dr. Bloom served as founder and executive director of the Sanctuary programs, inpatient psychiatric programs for the treatment of trauma-related emotional disorders.

In this presentation, Dr. Bloom will summarize key findings in developmental neuroscience, attachment research, with an emphasis on the knowledge accumulating about the impact of childhood adversity across the lifespan. During the presentation, she will summarize what we know about the impact of trauma on individuals and describe some key things she and her colleagues learned from their adult survivors of childhood adversity and the relevance those findings have for children today.

The keynote session will be followed by over 18 different session workshop choices. The conference adjourns at 3:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 9, 2014.
