

Call-to-Action for Public Education Tuesday, March 8

TALKING POINTS

Students across Pennsylvania have been missing out on educational opportunities since well before the state budget impasse began.

In the last six years academic and extracurricular programs have been lost, classroom sizes have ballooned, school libraries have shuttered, and the number of teachers and support staff have been greatly reduced. That is because:

- Pennsylvania has the largest funding gap between wealthy and poor schools of any other state in the country.
- State funding in recent years has not kept pace with necessary school costs.
- Schools are excessively dependent on local wealth for funding. In fact, the state's contribution to education funding is only 36%, among the lowest in the U.S.

ASK YOUR LAWMAKERS TO:

Provide a strong foundation for the sustainable, predictable and longterm investment that is needed in our public schools by adopting the fair funding formula recommended by the bipartisan Basic Education Funding Commission (BEFC), and making a significant new investment of \$600 million over this budget year and the next.
