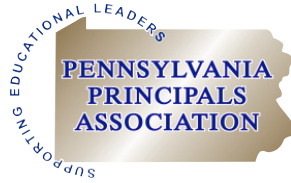


# Pennsylvania Principals Association

**Beth A. Haldeman, Ed.D.**, principal of Reamstown Elementary School, a pre-K-5 building in the Cocalico School District, is the President of the Pennsylvania Principals Association, headquartered in Summerdale, Pa. She is the first association president to serve a two-year term (2016-2018).

Dr. Haldeman has been a member of the PA Principals Association for the last 16 years. She most recently served on the Board of Directors as President-Elect, and prior to that she was the Central-II Elementary Regional Representative. In addition, Dr. Haldeman served as a co-chair of the 2016 PA Principals Association State Conference and she taught the PA Inspired Leadership Program (PIL) courses at the last five state conferences.

Dr. Haldeman began her career in education as a teacher at Northside Elementary School in the Palmyra Area School District (1992-1995); and also as a teacher at Lincoln, Fulton, Clay and Highland Elementary Schools in the Ephrata Area School District (1995-2000). She has been a principal in the Cocalico School District for the past 16 years, serving in her current position as principal at Reamstown Elementary School since 2008.

Dr. Haldeman served as an adjunct professor at Millersville University of PA and also as a guest presenter at Drexel University. She wrote five PIL courses for the PA Principals Association as well as several articles that were published in the *Pennsylvania Administrator* magazine. She continues to serve on numerous committees at the district level as well and serves as chair of the National Distinguished Principal Selection Committee and the By-Laws Committee for the PA Principals Association.

Dr. Haldeman is a graduate of Messiah College with a bachelor of science degree in elementary education, Millersville University of PA with a master's degree in reading and language arts and The Pennsylvania State University for her principal certificate. In 2015, she completed her doctorate of education at Drexel University, with her dissertation focused on professional development. She resides in Ephrata, is the wife of Rob Haldeman for the last 24 years and is the mother of three girls, ages 15, 12 and 8.
