The following criteria are to be used in the selection of the NOAP who will represent our state. The NOAP program is designed to recognize the outstanding leadership of active, on-line principals. It is not recognition of service at retirement or a program to reward current state or national association leaders.

The nominated assistant principal:

- Shows a strong commitment to the assistant principalship through **active membership in his/her state and national elementary principals associations** as well as other professional associations;
- Will remain an active assistant principal during the year in which he/she will **serve as NOAP**;
- Has been an active assistant principal for at least **two (2) years** (NOTE: Only those years served as a **building asst. principal** may count toward the necessary two);
- Is an active assistant principal of a school in which a commitment to excellence is clearly evident through programs designed to meet the academic and social needs of all students;
- Has firmly established community ties with parents and local business organizations;
- Is respected by students, colleagues, parents and the community at large;
- Shows strong educational leadership by setting high expectations for school staff and students; and
- Has exhibited exceptional leadership in a particular school program and/or is heavily involved in finding a solution to a problem faced by the school.
