Michael "Mike" Vereb is the Director of Government Affairs in the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General. Previously, he was a Republican member of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, representing the 150th legislative district from 2007-2017. In the House, he served in leadership as Secretary for four years. He served as president of the West Norriton Township Board of Commissioners prior to his election to the House of Representatives.

Before working in politics, Mr. Vereb worked in law enforcement. He worked for the West Conshohocken Police Department following graduation from the Montgomery County Police Academy in 1986. He also worked in Corporate Security for Comcast and Day & Zimmermann.

Brittney Kline is the Director for the *Safe2Say Something Program* in the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General. Brittney is a former police officer with Springettsbury Township Police Department in York County. She started with the PA Office of Attorney General as a Special Agent in the Child Predator Section and then moved into a position as a Supervisory Agent with the Office of Professional Responsibility. When the *Safe2Say Program* was implemented through the Office of Attorney General, she was selected, from many candidates, to be the Director.
