As a speaker, presenter, and trainer in more than 35 states and China, Costanzo works with students and activity advisers to make a difference in their schools and communities. Andy is the co-director of PASC's Susquehanna Gold Summer Leadership Camp, and a member of the PASC Executive Board.

Chris Seifert is a professional speaker, workshop director, actor and performer who has yet to meet an audience he didn't love. He has delivered keynote speeches and assemblies to schools and professional organizations across the country and overseas. Chris combines his love for performing on stage as an actor and singer with lessons he's learned in the professional world as an educator, coach, and workshop director to provide a unique experience for every group. He is formerly Director of Enrollment Management at a high school, a former Student Council advisor and coach, and also was a paralegal.
