The Summary Report should include:

- **Pre-conference comments from the teacher(s) involved in the plan.**
- Post-conference comments from the teacher(s) involved in the plan.
- A summary of the teacher improvement plan results.
- A summary of the action plan results.
- It should also answer the question, "Was the plan successful: Why or why not?"

The Total Participation Techniques Book Review should include:

- A synthesis of the reading.
- A minimum of 1 page, 12-point page font, double spaced.
- A description of the rationale of how the book connects to teaching, learning and supervision.
- It should be evident that the material from the book was understood and applied by the participant.

Job-Embedded Work:

- **Readings and Pre-Conference Assignments -** *approximately 4 hours*
- > Pre-Conference and Post-Conference *approximately 4 hours*
- Action Plan Design/Creation/Implementation, Summary Report Preparation and TPT Book Review approximately 11 hours
