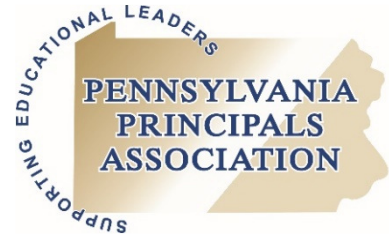


# ***Launching Leadership*** **July 26-27, 2023 – Kickoff** **State College, PA** ***25 Scholarships Available!***
