It seems like everyone in education is talking about the **Science of Reading.** Now we understand "how" students learn to read better than ever before. Plus we have evidence-based strategies to build students' reading skills.

Yes, neuroscience and research have taught us a lot about how kids read. So, let's use that.

But anyone who has ever worked in a school knows that true learning doesn't happen if kids aren't engaged. Unfortunately, when it comes to reading, students report they are bored and uninterested. Research tells us that this undermines reading achievement.

So, let's also find ways to truly engage students in their reading. Maybe even help them learn to love it.

To tap into both of these types of research, I present two books to you this month:

The first book describes the 5 essential components needed to teach reading (according to in-depth research): phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension.

The second book shares the 5 building blocks needed to help students find joy in reading: time,



access, choice, response and community. Five must be the magic number!

In addition to book summaries, I've also created a workshop you can use with teachers, "Teaching Reading for the Head and Heart." This workshop addresses the Science of Reading and the joy of reading. The goal is to share strategies teachers can use to cultivate reading joy along with phonics and evidence-based instruction.
